

### Introduction

JUKI-510 is designed for limited space applications with only the half size. It supports the full functions of an AT& ATX-compatible industrial computer on a single board. So it provides wake on LAN and Modem. The JUKI-510 is equipped with a low-power consumption and high performance GXLV/GX1 processor on board. It also contains an SDRAM DIMM socket that can support up to 256 MB memory.

The JUKI-510 provides an Ethernet interface, audio interface, Compact Flash Type II, EIDE interface, one parallel port, Two RS-232 serial ports, and a PS/2 keyboard/mouse interface. The built-in SVGA/LCD display controller supports both the CRT and LCD display simultaneously. It offers the resolutions of LCD screen up to 800 x 600 and CRT resolutions up to 1280 x 1024 @ 256 colors &1024x 768 @ 16 bpp. It also provides TV-OUT interface for PAL or NTSC TV. The display type is configured by software utility. The Flash ROM contains both the system BIOS and the VGA BIOS. Reprogramming the Flash ROM could do modification, in case of necessary.





# Installation

This chapter gives instructions about how to set up the JUKI-510 hardware, including directions of setting jumpers and connecting peripherals, switches and indicators. Before installation, please pay attention to the unpacking precautions on the following page for safety.

# 2.1 JUKI-510 Board Layout

### 2.2 Unpacking Precautions

Some components of JUKI-510 SBC are very sensitive to static electric charges and can be damaged by a sudden rush of power. To protect it from unintended damage, be sure to note these precautions:

Ground yourself to remove any static charge before touching the JUKI-510 SBC. You can do it by using a grounded wrist strap at all times or by frequently touching any conducting materials that is connected to the ground.

Handle your JUKI-510 SBC by its edges. Don't touch IC chips, leads or circuitry if not necessary.

Do not plug any connector or jumper while the power is on.

There is one 168-pin DIMM socket to accept 3.3V non-buffered SDRAM. The max. Memory size is 256MB.

### 2.3 Watchdog Timer Setting (JP1)

Reading port 443H enables the Watchdog Timer. It should be triggered before the time-out period ends, otherwise it will assume the program operation is abnormal and will issue a reset signal to start again. The Watchdog Timer is disabled by reading port 043/843H. For detail information about Watch-Dog Timer Refer to Appendix A

### 2.4 LCD Voltage and Clock Setting (JP2)

The LCD interface connector CN1 can provide 5V or 3.3V power supply by selecting the JP2 (1,3,5) to meet the different LCD requirement. And the JP2 (2,4,6) can provide normal or inverted Shift CLOCK for LCD.

### 2.6 COM2 Setting JP5,JP6(2,4,6)

The COM2 (CN21) can supply +5V or +12V power to the serial devices via RI pin (Pin 8) of the COM port connector. The max. current is 1A with fuse protection, from these two connector's 5V/12V output. If the output is set to 12V, make sure that you have 12V to supply to the board.

### COM2 RS-232, RS-422 or RS-485 Setting JP6(2,4,6)(Optional)

The COM2 (CN21) can be set to RS-232 or RS-422/485 for industrial field site application. Moreover when this port set to the RS-485 mode the board equipped self-tuner IC will automatic sensing the data direction to eliminate the data collision. This is especially important in WINDOWS programming which do not allow the program to catch the control pin at your wish. About the RS422 and RS485 function, It's optional for customer.



### **2.7 Clear CMOS Setup (JP6/1,3,5)**

If you need to clear the CMOS Setup (for example forgot the password you should clear the setup and then set the password again.), you should close the JP6(3,5) about 3 seconds, then open it again. Set back to normal operation mode.

### 3.1 LCD Interface Connector (CN1)

The JUKI-510 provides a 2x25-pin connector CN1, for the LCD flat panel interface and the LVDS interface.

The display options need to be setup manually from BIOS. The BIOS "Integrated Peripheral" Setup will allow you to choose display resolution either 640X480, 800X600 or 1024X768.

### 3.16 Digital I/O (CN27)

One characteristic of digital circuit is its fast response to high or low signal. This kind of response is highly needed for harsh and critical industrial operating environment. That's why we design 4-bit digital inputs and 4-bit digital outputs on the JUKI-510.

Digital Input and Output, generally, are control signals. You can use these signals to control external devices that needs On/Off circuit or TTL devices. The register address is 240H, 260H or 280H, which is selected in BIOS SETUP. You can read or write data to the selected address to enable the function of digital IO.

# **AWARD BIOS Setup**

### 5.1.1 Chipset

The JUKI-510 uses a Cyrix CX5530A chipset as its SVGA controller. It is compatible with many common 18-bit LCD displays and traditional analog CRT monitors. The VGA BIOS supports LCD. Besides, it also accepts interlaced and non-interlaced analog monitors (color and monochrome VGA) with high-resolution quality while maintaining complete IBM VGA compatibility. But digital monitors (i.e. MDA, CGA, and EGA) can be NOT supported. Multiple frequency (multisync) monitors are operated as if they were analog monitors.

#### 7.1 Introduction

The JUKI-510 provides a high performance 32-bit Ethernet chipset, which is completely compliant with IEEE 802.3 100 Mbps CSMA/CD standards. It is both 100Base-T and 10Base-T compatible. The major network operating system fits it.

The Ethernet port supplies a standard RJ-45 connector on board. To utilize the network boot feature is by incorporating the boot ROM image files for the appropriate network operating system.

# **Appendix A. Watchdog Timer**

The Watchdog Timer is a device to ensure that standalone systems can always recover from catastrophic conditions that cause the CPU to crash. This condition may have occurred by external EMI or a software bug. When the CPU stops working normally, hardware on the board will perform hardware reset (cold boot) to bring the system back to a known state.

Three I/O ports control the Watchdog Timer.

443 (hex)	Read	Enable the refresh the Watch-Dog Timer.
043/843 (hex)	Read	Disable the Watchdog Timer.

Prior to enable the Watchdog Timer, user has to define Timer first. The output data is a value of time interval and the range of the value is from 01(hex) to FF (hex) and time interval 1 sec to 255 sec.

This will enable and activate the countdown timer which will eventually time out and reset the CPU to ensure that this reset condition does not occur, the Watchdog Timer must be periodically refreshed by reading the same I/O port 043/843H and 443H. This must be done within the time out period that is selected by software, please refer to the example program.

A tolerance of at least 5% must be maintained to avoid unknown routines within the operating system (DOS), such as disk I/O that can be very time consuming. Therefore if the time out period has been set to 10 seconds, the I/O port 443H must be read within 7 seconds.

Note: when exiting a program it is necessary to disable the Watchdog Timer, otherwise the system will reset.
